NETIA K2 POLISH WINTER EXPEDITION 2002 / 2003

W ith start of this winter expedition to K2 in mid-December, the greatest remaining challenge of modern Himalayan alpinism, 2002 proclaimed THE INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF MOUNTAINS by the United Nations is brought to a close. The Netia

K2 (8.611 m), the second highest mountain on Earth, is believed to be not only one of the most beautiful eight-thousand meter peaks, but also the most difficult to climb. It is situated on the border separating China from Pakistan, close to the antique Silk Road. The history of its exploration is long and extremely dramatic. Less than 200 persons have reached its summit to date. Nobody has yet managed to climb K2 in winter.

HISTORY OF WINTER K2 EXPLORATION AND EXPEDITIONS

Winter 1984/1985 – First reconnaissance via Baltoro Glacier (Andrzej Zawada/Jacques Olek)

Winter 1987/1988 – First winter K2 expedition from the Pakistani side - Abruzzi ridge (leader: Andrzej Zawada with coleaders: Roger Mear and Jacques Olek). Two teams of that expedition has reached the highest point (7350 m), Wielicki/Cichy, Mear/Gagnon.

Winter 2000 – First reconnaissance of the north side of K2 (Darek Zaluski/Jacques Olek)

Winter 2002 – First winter K2 expedition/north pillar (Leader: Krzysztof Wielicki, deputy leader: Jacques Olek). 16 December 2002 - 15 March 2003. Participants: 25 persons (himalaists, medical personnel, technicians: radio operator, TVP journalists and film makers, as well as a correspondent of "Rzeczpospolita").
